## Container Refrigerator Service Manual

When operating the transport refrigerator, verify that there are no personnel in the container • Leaving personnel inside the container may lead to death from exposure to the cold Do not touch any portion of the transport refrigerator other than the control panel during operation

## SOLAS - Kuehne

The Verified Gross Mass of a packed container should be provided to the next party taking custody of the container ("Handshake"-Principle) If a packed container is transported by road, rail or a vessel to which the SOLAS regulations do not apply and delivered to a port terminal

## STANDARD CONTAINER DETAILS

- Weight restrictions may be considered throughout the whole transport leg National rules and regulations for road and rail transport, capacity limitations of cranes in seaport and inland-terminals as well as other factors may overrule the possible payload of a container

Transport is thus a derived demand and carriers and third party service providers who engage in the chain of transportation must derive value from and add value to the movement (Robinson, 2002) The container line will usually carry a vast number of different commodities (Stopford, 2009)
